





To maintain and develop our suburb's unique character and enhance the amenity of Kensington for the benefit of all residents.

Established in 1977, we are a non-profit resident action group consisting of people just like you - Kensington people who are committed to the future of our community. Our day-to-day business is conducted by an unpaid Steering Committee of volunteers, elected each year at the Annual General Meeting of our Association.

The Kensington Association was preceded by a number of other organisations with similar objectives, including the Flemington/Kensington Progress Association of the 1940s and the Kensington Social Action Group.

- We work to preserve the character and amenity of our community and improve the delivery of services to its residents.
- We maintain a good working relationship with our local Council, the City of Melbourne, ensuring that both Councillors and Council officers are fully aware of residents' concerns.
- We provide leadership for community campaigns such as the 'Hands off Holland Park' campaign, the 'Reunite Kensington' campaign and the campaign to oppose the use of the Broadmeadows Line for the proposed airport rail service.
- We monitor proposed building developments in Kensington, supporting those that enhance amenity, and opposing those that are inappropriate.
- We represent Kensington residents on committees, such as the Holland Park Redevelopment Committee and the Community Liaison Committee for the Kensington Estate redevelopment project.
- We speak for you and provide advocacy for you when organisations ask us to comment on proposed new developments.
